The Importance of the Tabernacle in the Catholic Religion

The word tabernacle is very important in our Catholic vocabulary. We use it often when instructing our children about Jesus, and His sacramental presence in the Church. We genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle as an act of worship directed to Jesus in the Most Holy Holy Eucharist, which is reserved in the tabernacle. We place a red lamp near the tabernacle in every Church to make it easier to find it, and we adorn the tabernacle with great beauty to show how significant its function is. So what is a tabernacle, why is it so significant to the design of the Church, and the culture of true worship? For this week, let's answer the first question: "what is a tabernacle?"

The word tabernacle simply means tent. In the ancient world, many people were nomadic, which meant they traveled constantly. This same life style was adopted by the people of Israel after they fled from slavery in Egypt. As the people wandered in the desert, God was present to them through the prophet Moses, but most notably, by being present in the Meeting Tent, which was the first tabernacle. They could draw close to the "tabernacle" of the Lord, but they could never enter it. There before the meeting tent the People of Israel could draw close to the presence of God, and receive instruction and guidance through the Lord's revelations to Moses. Today, we draw close to God by worshiping Him in His Church, drawing close to Jesus in the Eucharist, which is reserved in the tabernacle in our sanctuary. God dwells in our midst in the tabernacle.

La palabra Tabernáculo es muy importante en nuestro vocabulario Católico. Lo usamos a menudo cuando instruimos a nuestros hijos acerca de Jesús y su presencia Sacramental en la Iglesia. Hacemos una genuflexión en dirección al Tabernáculo como un acto de adoración dirigido a Jesús en la Santísima Eucaristía, que está reservada en el Tabernáculo. Colocamos una lámpara roja cerca del Tabernáculo en cada Iglesia para que sea más fácil encontrarlo, y adornamos el Tabernáculo con gran belleza para mostrar cuán significativa es su función. Entonces, ¿qué es un Tabernáculo, por qué es tan importante para el diseño de la Iglesia y la cultura de la verdadera adoración? Para esta semana, respondamos la primera pregunta: ¿Qué es un Tabernáculo?

La palabra tabernáculo simplemente significa tienda. En el mundo antiguo, muchas personas eran nómadas, lo que significaba que viajaban constantemente. Este mismo estilo de vida fue adoptado por el pueblo de Israel después de huir de la esclavitud en Egipto. Mientras la gente vagaba por el desierto, Dios estaba presente para ellos a través del profeta Moisés, pero más notablemente, al estar presente en la tienda de reunión, que fue el primer tabernáculo. Podían acercarse al "Tabernáculo" del Señor, pero nunca podían entrar en él. Allí, frente a la tienda de reunión, el pueblo de Israel podía acercarse a la presencia de Dios y recibir instrucción y guía por medio de las revelaciones del Señor a Moisés. Hoy, nos acercamos a Dios adorándolo en Su Iglesia, acercándonos a Jesús en la Eucaristía, que está reservada en el tabernáculo de nuestro santuario. Dios mora en medio de nosotros en el tabernáculo.

FAITH FORMATION/CCD & CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

The Protecting God's Children® Program for Adults teaches clergy, diocesan / parish / school / agency employees, volunteers, parents and other caring adults to recognize the warning signs of sexual abuse and to respond appropriately.

Effective July 11, 2022 in-person training sessions are offered weekly at the Pastoral Center in Springfield, Massachusetts on the following days and times:

- 9:00 AM – First and Third Monday of Each Month
- 1:00 PM – Second and Fourth Thursday of Each Month
- 6:00 PM – Second Thursday of Each Month

Training sessions are three-hours in length. Given the sensitive nature of material presented, attendance at these three-hour training session is restricted to adults. Please note that a ZOOM option is available for those unable to attend in person.

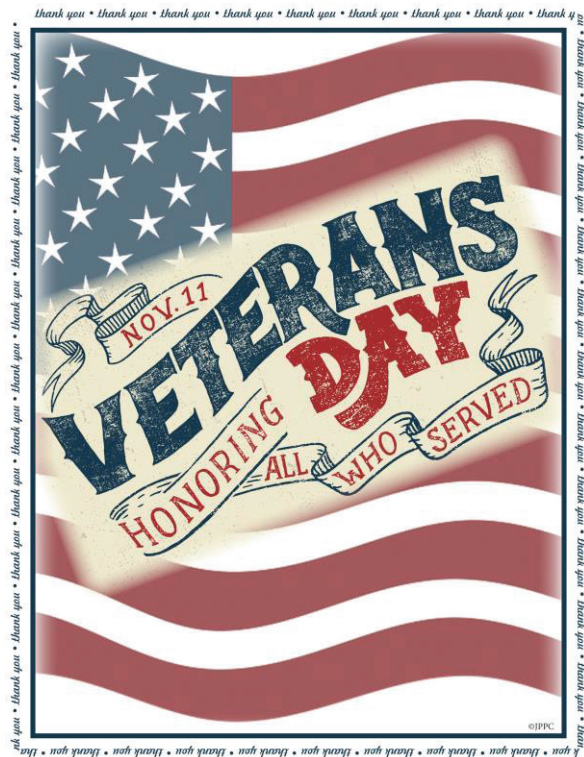
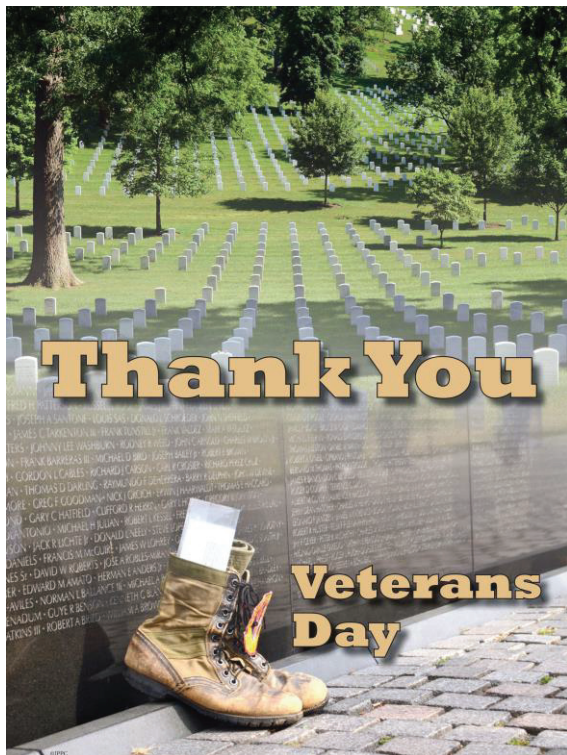

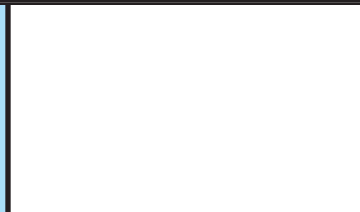
