WORSHIP



Dear Friends

This Sunday, throughout the Church, marks "World Mission Sunday." in his message for this day, Pope Francis reflected on the importance of the Church's commitment to being missionaries for the Gospel. He highlights the fact that the gospel message is mediated through personal witness and community life. As St. John notes: "...we proclaim to you what we have heard and seen..." (1 Jn 1: 1-3). Missionaries who venture to foreign lands do so with immense trust in the Lord Jesus. They are meant to be signs of God's presence in their midst. They show those to whom they minister that the Lord cares for them, that even today He enters their world with a message of salvation and the forgiveness of sins. Our Holy Father commented on this in his message for World Mission Sunday: "...we recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel. Let us remember especially those who resolutely set out, leaving home and family behind, to bring the Gospel to all those places and people athirst for its saving message."

I could not help but think how even our own backyard has become missionary territory. Nationwide the practice of the faith is down to just 17%. Our church's pews seem more empty these days. Our priests are stretched thin, often working multiple positions and long hours. Vocations to the priesthood are booming in some places but here, in Western Mass we have just 2 seminarians. I don't mean to paint a dismal picture, however, the state of the practice of the faith in our area is depressing.

On this Mission Sunday, we are reminded that the Church, by her very nature, is missionary. And we, her members, are called to be missionaries. We need to have the courage to bear witness to the Gospel message of salvation. We need to be bold in proclaiming the Kingdom of God with joy in our hearts and concern for souls. We need to be willing to be Christ for others. As our Holy Father states: "To be on mission is to be willing to think as Christ does, to believe with him that those around us are also my brothers and sisters. May this compassionate love touch our hearts and make us all true missionary disciples."

UPDATED NUMBERS FOR THE 2022 ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

EDUCATION

FAITH FORMATION/CCD & CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Classes for students up to the 8th grade have begun for the 2022-23 school year. They take place at the Social Center on Sunday right after the 10:30a.m. Mass. If your child was not baptized here at Holy Name, you must present us with a Baptism certificate from the church where they were baptized. Class schedules are available at the social center and on the website holynamespringfieldma.org.

For 9th, 10th and 11th grade students, Confirmation classes take place on certain Sundays from 5:00-6:00p.m. in the church. The next class takes place on November 6th.

The deadline to register your children for the 2022-23 season for both CCD and Confirmation is October 30th. Registration forms are still available on the table at the parking lot entrance of the church. The cost is \$40 per child, or \$70 for a family.

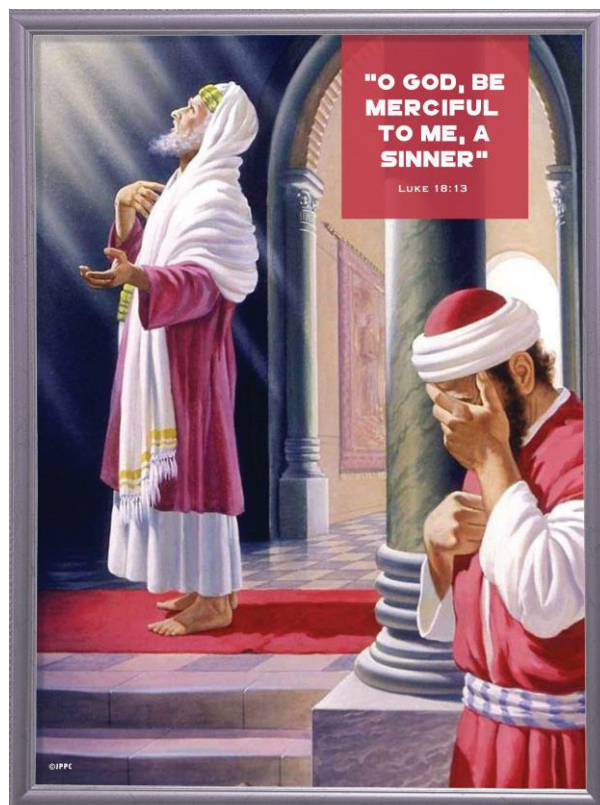
