Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the name of the Lord!

I am writing to ask for your prayerful support for the **Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS)**, as part of the Diocese of Springfield's participation in **the 2022 Triennial National Collection**. The AMS was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is, "*Serving Those Who Serve*," providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. This includes members of our own diocese. While the salaries and retirement of military chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of programs and services vital to the mission and ministry of its mission, including Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal and Veterans Affairs. Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections and relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its aforementioned programs and services. Your support of the 2022 Triennial National Collection for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our Country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from your own parish family. Thank you, in advance, for your generosity.

EDUCATION

FAITH FORMATION/CCD & CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Classes for students up to the 8th grade for the 2022-23 school year take place at the Social Center on Sunday right after the 10:30a.m. Mass. If your child was not baptized here at Holy Name, you must present us with a Baptism certificate from the church where they were baptized. Class schedules are available at the social center and on the website holynamespringfieldma.org.

For 9th, 10th and 11th grade students, Confirmation classes take place on certain Sundays from 5:00-6:00p.m. in the church. The next class takes place on November 6th.

The deadline to register your children for the 2022-23 season for both CCD and Confirmation is this Sunday, October 30th. Registration forms are still available on the table at the parking lot entrance of the church. The cost is \$40 per child, or \$70 for a family.

ATTENTION ALL VOLUNTEERS – SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING:

THE FOLLOWING IS A MANDATORY REQUIREMENT FOR ANYONE WORKING WITH CHILDREN (I.E., Teachers, Coaches, Etc.) AND ANYONE WORKING WITH VULNERABLE POPULATIONS (I.E. Elderly and/or Persons With Disabilities) –

The Diocese of Springfield provides VIRTUS® in-person and Zoom awareness training for adults to help identify and prevent child sexual abuse. The Protecting God's Children® Program for Adults teaches clergy, diocesan / parish / school / agency employees, volunteers, parents and other caring adults to recognize the warning signs of sexual abuse and to respond appropriately.

Effective July 11, 2022 in-person training sessions are offered weekly at the Pastoral Center in Springfield, Massachusetts on the following days and times:

- 9:00 AM – First and Third Monday of Each Month
- 1:00 PM – Second and Fourth Thursday of Each Month
- 6:00 PM – Second Thursday of Each Month

Training sessions are three-hours in length. Given the sensitive nature of material presented, attendance at these three-hour training session is restricted to adults. Please note that a ZOOM option is available for those unable to attend in person.

In addition to the adult trainings listed above, trainings will be held at various locations throughout the Diocese of Springfield during the year. For a list of available training sessions, please register for a VIRTUS®*Online* account or log into your current account at www.virtusonline.org.

TO ATTEND A TRAINING YOU MUST PRE-REGISTER THROUGH VIRTUS®*ONLINE*. To register to attend a three-hour awareness session, please go online to www.virtusonline.org and select "Registration" for the "Springfield Diocese," then follow the prompts.
