

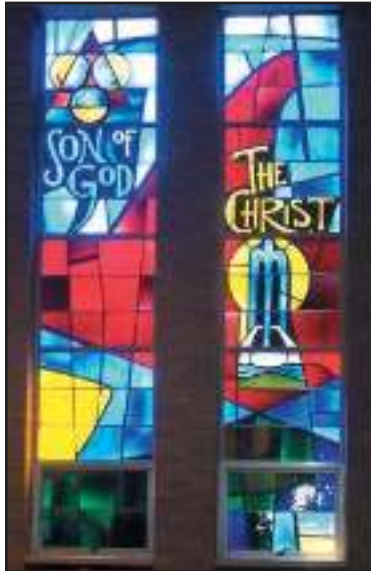

From Your Parish Administrator

Jesus poses the question, who do you say I am? With the context of this question in mind, I saw a couple of links between the reading from Prophet Isaiah and the Gospel of Saint Matthew. First in Matthew's story we read how Peter is chosen by Jesus to be the foundation of his Church. Jesus does not say to Peter I choose you. He chooses him because he has been gifted with Revelation. Peter has been given blessings and gifts to be the foundation. Secondly, in Prophet Isaiah, Eliakim is being chosen. He is being chosen and gifted to replace Shebna who was exploiting his position for personal gain. Noticing this link felt like an invitation to ask, how I am I chosen? What gifts have I been given and how am I called to use them?

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK
