



Message of the Week



From Your Parish Administrator

Today we are celebrating the Third Sunday of Advent. It is Rejoice Sunday flowing from the words of the Entrance Antiphon," Rejoice in the Lord always:" again I say rejoice. The Lord is near. There is a sense of excited joy spoken by the Prophet in our First Reading for this liturgy. The verses might sound familiar, because Jesus in the Fourth Chapter of Luke's Gospel unrolls this very passage, reads these lines and turns to His Nazareth -neighbors and announces that this reading is actually about Him.

This poem splits the chapter before and after this one. Those deal with the resurrection and beauty of Jerusalem which is going to return to its world-centering dignity. The Prophet is pictured here as the favored one of God. This Prophet has been called and given the mission of bringing back to life and freedom the people of Israel as does the earth bring back its vegetation to the gardens.

Rejoicing is not the same as satisfaction: it is more about the simplicity of wonder. Advent is not about going back to better times but experiencing the light which is leading us somewhere deeper.

Our *Advent Retreat* continues on Sunday, December 17th, from 2-2:45p.m. at our church.

"In light of the tragic events in Israel, we will be praying a Rosary for peace in the world, every Sunday of Advent starting at 10:00 AM. Bring your own needs and intentions as well."

REMEMBERING THE HOMEBOUND AT CHRISTMASTIME

We have a list of parishioners who are homebound, and if you are interested in either sending them a note or card, calling them to chat, or visiting (with* or without a gift), their names will be on the Giving Tree in the Dickinson Street foyer (if the tree is in decent shape). You have until January 7th (a.k.a. known as "Little Christmas" - The Epiphany) to reach out. *Candies are always a hit, or some hand crème, or pens, stamps, note cards, and the like. Perhaps a call prior to a visit would be best, to ensure what you are thinking of bringing will work best.

There will be a *Bible Study* with Sr. Leila on the first Tuesday of each month starting in January from 10-10:45a.m. in the church. We will be studying the Beatitudes. Everyone is welcomed to come.



Are you registered as a parishioner? If not, just call or email the secretary, and she will mail or email the form to you. Yes, it's that easy! And, if you are asked to be a Godparent for a Baptism or a Confirmation sponsor, you will be asked which church you attend, and if we are asked to verify it, we can only do so if you have registered with us.

An FYI, when trying to reach a priest in an emergency situation to administer the Sacrament of the Sick for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.
