WORSHIP



From Your Parish Administrator

The Reading gives us two mind-boggling images. We get to picture Abraham, a God-fearing person with a knife in his hand poised to hand over his only and beloved son. This is quite a frightening act of doing what God seems to be asking. It is that, but also not quite so. It is required in the Book of Leviticus that the first born of animals or of human origin, as well as the first fruits of harvest all be surrendered, or handed over to God. Isaac fits the prescription. Clearly it is a story to be remembered by those who are following Abraham's faith journey. It does catch one's attention: faith has consequences. The consequences for Abraham were the promises of fruitfulness which extended to vast lands and abundant descendants. For the faithful Jews, there was the always -present need to hear of God's saving actions. The Pentateuch of which Genesis is the first book is an inspired history and constant reminder of how, while they are called to listen and obey, God will always save them from their enemies and themselves.

Peter says in response to this event and seeing Jesus talking with Moses and Elijah, that it is good to be there. When next these three are alone with Jesus up the hill and in the garden of Jesus agony, it will not seem good for them to be so present. Perhaps the transfiguration was the experience of Jesus being more intense than the apostles were ready for, and so, too, in the Garden. We are invited during these days of Lent to be freed from closing the book of our mysteries and to stay open and present to see what God is not taking away, but offering.

DIOCESE OF SPRINGFIELD 2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
- 4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ends at age fifty-nine (59).

<u>Please note</u>: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.

Second Sunday of Lent – February 25, 2024

An FYI, when trying to reach a priest in an emergency situation to administer the Sacrament of the Sick for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

En los días de ayuno, otras dos comidas sin carne se pueden tomar de acuerdo con las necesidades de cada uno, pero juntas no deben equivaler a otra comida completa.

- 2. Los otros Viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia de carne.
- 3. La obligación de abstenerse de comer carne comienza a 14 años de edad y no cesa.
 - 4. La obligación de ayunar comienza a los 18 años y termina a los 59.

Recuerde: que Aunque los fieles pueden excusarse del ayuno y la abstinencia, por una causa justa, existe la obligación de sustituirla por otra penitencia. Ningún Católico Debe excusarse de estas obligaciones cuaresmales.
