

From Your Parish Administrator

Today's Second Reading needs a little commentary: it ought to be prayed over very slowly, especially worthy of personal reflection are the words about our having been saved is by a tremendous gift of grace and not by our works. In a very special way we are created by grace to do those good works which flow from that same participation in God's holiness and life which is grace itself. Please pray with and perhaps assimilate this central passage of our freedom and faith.

The Evangelist takes time to narrate to us his perception he has of God thus: God loves this world and has always loved it into a further revelation of that love. He writes: He sent the Son to offer eternal life. This saving of the world is not merely the judicial non-condemnation of its inhabitants but saving the world from not being a revelation place. The inhabitants are saved from the dark of not knowing who they are; saved from not knowing the good works for which they were also saved.

The concluding remarks of the Gospel highlights light battling darkness. Jesus as the light both enlightens those who see Him and believe him, but calls to all to come out into the light and do those works which are lights by which the goodness of God might be seen as well.

As we progress with the discipline of Lent, we are invited to pray for the experience of being so loved by God that by that grace we will light up this world from the various limitations it encounters.

DIOCESE OF SPRINGFIELD 2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
- 4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ends at age fifty-nine (59).

<u>Please note</u>: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.

An FYI, when trying to reach a priest in an <u>emergency situation</u> to administer the Sacrament of the Sick for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

Reglamento de Cuaresma 2024 de la Diócesis de Springfield

 El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días de abstinencia de carne, así Como días de ayuno, cuando solo se permite una comida completa. En los días de ayuno, otras dos comidas sin carne se pueden tomar de acuerdo con las necesidades de cada uno, pero juntas no deben equivaler a otra comida completa.
Los otros Viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia de carne.
La obligación de abstenerse de comer carne comienza a 14 años de edad y no cesa.
La obligación de ayunar comienza a los 18 años y termina a los 59.
Recuerde: que Aunque los fieles pueden excusarse del ayuno y la abstinencia, por una causa justa, existe la obligación de sustituirla por otra penitencia. 
