

New Dates and Day for Bible Study

An FYI, when trying to reach a priest in an *emergency situation* to administer the Sacrament of the Sick for someone in the hospital - if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.


Holy Name Youth Soccer Sign-ups and Looking for Volunteer Coaches


