

From Your Parochial Vicar

Being a Christian is equivalent to being called to bear fruits of holiness. And to bear fruits we have to be like the branches attached to the vine. Christ is the vine (Gospel). And we will be united to him by keeping his commandment, which is to believe by faith in his name and loving one another as he commanded us (2^{nd} reading). By the grace that is given to us in the sacraments, especially in the Eucharist, Christ remains in us and we in him. Through the Eucharistic sacrifice, God makes us partakers of his divinity (Prayer over the offerings). Without it we can do nothing. It is his words that should always guide our lives.

While Fr. John is away, Fr. Alex will be assuming a good portion of his duties. Please feel free to reach out to him in Fr. John's absence. Fr. Alex has a new temporary extension, and it is 114. We will inform you as soon as he receives his permanent one. (There has to be some drilling done to have the phone in the proper place.)

Next Sunday, May 5th, the 10:30a.m. Mass will be bi-lingual in celebration of the First Communion of 40 students from our 2023-24 Religious Education program. This Mass is open to everyone.

SAFETY TIP FOR PARISHIONERS

If you are approached either in church or out in the parking for money, please do not comply. We do not want to encourage this practice, and want to do our best to keep our parishioners and Mass attendees safe and free from solicitations. If this happens to you, please call the rectory to report it (we will ask where, what time, general description of the person) and we will take the steps necessary to hopefully discourage this from happening again.



Are you registered as a parishioner? If not, just call or email the secretary, and she will mail or email the form to you. Yes, it's that easy! And, if you are asked to be a Godparent for a Baptism or a Confirmation sponsor, you will be asked which church you attend, and if we are asked to verify it, we can only do so if you have registered with us.

An FYI, when trying to reach a priest in an <u>emergency situation</u> to administer the Sacrament of the Sick for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.


