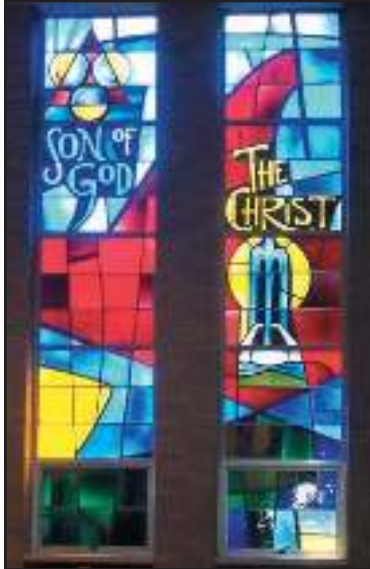

From Your Pastor

What we hear in Today's First Reading is, God's coming down and blessing the elders gathered together in the Tent which is located outside the camp. For some unexplained reason, two elders remained in camp. They had made the starting line-up but failed to show up for the blessing. Nevertheless, these two no-shows, begin to prophesy in the camp and are reported to Moses. Moses responds with great wish that all the people would be in-spirited by God.

Mark presents a similar conversation between John and Jesus. John reports to Jesus as Joshua had reported to Moses that somebody other than the disciples has been doing some driving out a demon in the name of Jesus. The power seems to have been stolen from the disciples and Jesus' answer affirms a Markan theme. All power to save, heal and bring order reside in and flow through Jesus. If there is any work of bringing the human family closer to the all-powerful creator and healing within each member of the human family, then it is Jesus doing the work no matter who are the instruments. Jesús states whoever is not against them is for them. The passage of Mark's Gospel reminds us to be slow to criticize and quick to encourage. This then becomes a great lesson of inclusivity. Many people have the mindset of exclusivity or the "WE" versus "Others" attitude

Eucharistic Adoration: Tuesdays, 1-5p.m., Chaplet prayed at 3p.m., Rosary at 4:30p.m. followed by Benediction. Thank you for your kindness in making sure there is always someone here in church during Adoration time.

On the first Saturday of every month, the **Blue Army** group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 10:30a.m. Everyone is invited to stay after Mass to take part.

When trying to reach a priest in an **emergency situation** to administer the **Sacrament of the Sick** for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

STEWARDSHIP

Collective Mass Intentions will be available at Holy Name

Collective intentions, also referred to as “multiple” intentions (at one Mass) are permitted per a notice received from the Diocese of Springfield, Office of the Chancellor. This means that we can accept more than one intention by one family at one Mass. These Masses cannot be celebrated more than twice each week, nor on a feast day. So, beginning with the first Sunday in November, which is November 3rd, we will be celebrating Masses with “Collective Intentions” at 10:30a.m. and at the 12:30p.m. Spanish Mass. Those are the Masses that seem to be the most requested, so it would make sense that those are the two where there will be multiple intentions permitted.

Basically, the only difference will be, if you call in to schedule a Mass Intention for Sunday at either 10:30 or 12:30, you will not hear “I am sorry, that Mass is already taken”, instead your intention will be accepted. (Note: we do want to keep the number of intentions to 10 or less.) If you need further clarification, please see a priest after Mass or call the rectory office during the week.

The raise in the customary **MASS INTENTION OFFERING** to \$15.00 comes from the bishops of the ecclesiastical province, not from the Bishop of Springfield (canon 952). This applies to new requests and is not retroactive. He asked that we remind people that this is not a price or fee, and that they may offer more, less or even nothing for a requested Mass intention. The \$15.00 limit answers the question, “What is the customary offering?”
