

From Your Pastor

There is a back-and-forth spirit in today's Readings. In the First Reading, Peter and other Apostles are back in court after having been sent forth to stop teaching in the name of Jesus. In the Gospel there are quite some touching scenes. Peter and the other Apostles go back to their fishing and Jesus calls them and sends Peter forth to extend Jesus' teachings'. Now Jesus who had told them at His washing of the feet that apart from Him they could do nothing, do nothing for their all-night fishing. When it was already dawning the great Fisherman appears and catches them according to what catches Fisherman, a great catch of fish. As time unfolds to them there is the scene of the reunion at the breakfast table. The final scene focuses in on the recommitment of Peter and the missioning of Peter by Jesus. Peter is invited to follow Jesus once more and this time for keeps. This scene ends with Peter's following Jesus to a life which will imitate that of Jesus even to the manner of His death. As an Easter people we are reminded Easter is the celebration of Jesus showing up and inviting us to follow Him in doing the same. We stand on various shores with our pasts in our hands and hearts and minds. Easter happens when we experience His acceptance of our pasts and His invitation to continue showing up for our futures. We, WHO FOLLOW Peter and who follows Jesus, continue speaking His Name in all the ways we show up.

Eucharistic Adoration - 1-4p.m. on Tuesdays

The Chaplet will still be prayed at 3p.m. and the Rosary at 3:30p.m. followed by Benediction.

When trying to reach a priest in an <u>emergency situation</u> to administer the **Sacrament of the Sick** for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

On the first Saturday of every month, the Blue Army group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 9:30a.m. Everyone is invited to take part.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Parroco, P. John Tibakunirwa.

Hay un espíritu de ida y vuelta en las Lecturas de hoy. En la Primera Lectura, Pedro y los demás Apóstoles están nuevamente ante el tribunal después de haber sido enviados a dejar de enseñar en nombre de Jesús. En el Evangelio, se presentan escenas conmovedoras. Pedro y los otros Apóstoles regresan a su antigua ocupación de pescadores, y Jesús los llama y envía a Pedro a continuar con Sus enseñanzas. Jesús, quien les había dicho durante el lavatorio de los pies que, separados de El, no podían hacer nada, les demuestra esta verdad: no logran pescar nada durante toda la noche. Al amanecer, aparece el gran Pescador y les concede una gran pesca, según lo que atrae a un pescador. Con el paso del tiempo, se da la escena del reencuentro en la mesa del desayuno. La escena final se centra en el nuevo compromiso de Pedro y en la misión que Jesús le encomienda. Pedro es invitado a seguir a Jesús una vez más, y esta vez para siempre. Esta escena termina con Pedro siguiendo a Jesús hacia una vida que imitará la de Él, incluso en la forma de su muerte. Como pueblo de Pascua, se nos recuerda que la Pascua es la celebración de la presencia de Jesús, quien se manifiesta y nos invita a seguirlo haciendo lo mismo. Nos encontramos en diversas orillas, con nuestro pasado en las manos, en el corazón y en la mente. La Pascua sucede cuando experimentamos Su aceptación de nuestro pasado y Su invitación a seguir apareciendo en nuestro futuro. Nosotros, que seguimos a Pedro, y quien sigue a Jesús, continuamos pronunciando Su Nombre en todas las formas en que nos hacemos presentes.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SCAMS!

By learning some of the key things scammers tend to say on the phone, you may be able to spot a caller with nefarious intent before they can trick you into falling for their lies. Never respond if you hear one of the following phrases:

- "Can you hear me?": If a call starts with a "yes" or "no" question, chances are a scammer is trying to record you saying "yes" so they can authorize purchases on your accounts.
- "I'm from the government and need to verify your Social ...": Know that government representatives would never call unexpectedly and ask for your Social Security number or other sensitive information by phone.
- "You've won! All you need to pay is ...": If you really won a contest, you wouldn't be asked to pay for shipping or anything else. This is a tactic scammers use to snag your credit card or bank information.
- "Act now!": Scammers will pressure you to act immediately because they want you to make a snap decision rather than realizing that they're not legit, which will likely happen if they give you time to think.
- "Don't hang up ...": Another common phrase, a scam caller will demand you stay on the line because they don't want you to have an opportunity to fact-check what they're saying and realize they're lying.
- "I'm calling from Amazon...": If a caller claims to be with Amazon and is calling about a suspicious order, they're trying to scam you. Don't fall for it, and don't give them any information about your account.

As said, never share personal information with a caller who's using high-pressure tactics or seems otherwise suspicious. Instead, end the call immediately. If you shared personal or financial info with a caller before you realized the call was a scam, take steps to protect yourself, like monitoring your bank accounts and credit card activity. You might also want to consider <u>freezing your credit</u> for a time, especially if you gave the scammer any information that could be used for identity theft. Phone scammers change their tactics regularly, so it's important to report the scam to the appropriate watchdog agencies. That's how these agencies identify widespread scam attempts and alert consumers to be on the lookout. If you think you've been contacted by a phone scammer, report the call to the <u>Federal Trade Commission</u> and the <u>FBI field office</u> in your area. Lastly, if a scammer succeeds in defrauding you, contact your local police department and report it to the FBI via its <u>Internet Crime Compliance Center</u>.
