WORSHIP

From Your Pastor



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, "Vanity of Vanities, says Ecclesiastes, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity. "These striking words from Ecclesiastes set the stage for our reflection today. Consider how the sacred author continues. "For here is a man who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored over it, he must leave his property." How often do we find ourselves in this very predicament? Our Psalm today reminds us "You turn man back to dust, saying, "return, O children of men." this eternal truth echoes an old proverb:" We come into this World with empty hands, with empty hands we shall depart." The Psalmist wisdom teaches us to "number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart."

In Colossians, Paul provides the antidote to worldly attachment: "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth". He urges us to "put to death" our earthly parts-immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed. As the ancient saying goes: "The richest person is not the one who has the most, but the one who knows what he/she has to be closer to God following His ways all the while." Today's Gospel presents the parable of the rich fool. When a man approaches Jesus about inheritance, Our Lord responds with a warning: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." the rich man in the parable builds bigger barns for his abundance, only to have his life demanded of him that very night. As an ancient proverb states: "A shroud has no pockets."

Dear friends, let us heed these Scripture Readings: " call to seek true wealth-not in earthly possessions that moth and rust destroy, but in heavenly treasures that last eternally. For as Jesus teaches us, "what profit is there for one to gain the whole world yet lose or forfeit himself?" Let us pray for the wisdom to store up treasures in Heaven, where our hearts truly belong.

Eucharistic Adoration - 1-4p.m. on Tuesdays

The Chaplet will still be prayed at 3p.m. and the Rosary at 3:30p.m. followed by Benediction.

When trying to reach a priest in an emergency situation to administer the Sacrament of the Sick for someone in the hospital – if a parish priest isn't immediately available and time is critical, there should be a Chaplain available 24/7 at each of the area hospitals.

On the first Saturday of every month, the Blue Army group follows the 8:15a.m. Mass with a rosary, meditation on the mysteries and confession until approximately 9:30a.m. Everyone is invited!

Earlier this week, in a court filing, the IRS released an interpretation of the long held Johnson Amendment which addresses political endorsements. That statement was pertaining to a very specific case. In consultation with the USCCB, Bishop has issued the following statement.

"In its recent filing the IRS was addressing a specific case, which doesn't change how the Catholic Church engages in public debate. The Church seeks to help Catholics form their conscience in the Gospel so they might discern which candidates and policies would advance the common good. COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Pastor, John Chrysostom Tibakunirwa

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo Vanidad de vanidades dice el Eclesiastés, vanidad de vanidades, Todo es vanidad. Estas palabras tan impactantes del libro de Eclesiastés preparan el terreno para nuestra reflexión de hoy. Consideremos cómo continúa el autor sagrado: Pues he aquí un hombre que ha trabajado con sabiduría, conocimiento y destreza, y sin embargo debe dejar su herencia a otro que no ha trabajado por ella. ¿Cuántas veces nos encontramos nosotros mismos en esa misma situación? El Salmo de hoy nos recuerda: "Haces que el hombre vuelva al polvo, diciendo: 'Regresen, hijos de los hombres.'" Esta verdad eterna resuena con un antiguo proverbio: "Venimos a este mundo con las manos vacías, y con las manos vacías partiremos. La sabiduría del salmista nos enseña a contar nuestros días con sabiduría, para alcanzar un corazón sensato. En la carta a los Colosenses, san Pablo nos ofrece el antídoto contra el apego a lo terrenal: "Piensen en las cosas de arriba, no en las de la tierra." Nos exhorta a dar muerte a lo terrenal que hay en ustedes, la inmoralidad, la impureza, las pasiones, los malos deseos y la codicia. Como dice un antiguo dicho, "La persona más rica no es la que más tiene, sino la que sabe lo que tiene para acercarse más a Dios siguiendo Sus caminos en todo momento." El Evangelio de hoy nos presenta la parábola del rico insensato.

Cuando un hombre se acerca a Jesús para hablarle de una herencia, nuestro Señor le responde con una advertencia: "Estén atentos y guárdense de toda avaricia, porque aunque alguien posea muchas riquezas, su vida no depende de sus bienes." En la parábola, el hombre rico construye graneros más grandes para guardar su abundancia, solo para que esa misma noche le sea pedida su vida. Como afirma otro antiguo proverbio: "El sudario no tiene bolsillos." Queridos amigos, escuchemos el llamado de estas lecturas bíblicas, un llamado a buscar la verdadera riqueza, no en posesiones terrenales que la polilla y el óxido destruyen, sino en tesoros celestiales que duran eternamente. Porque como nos enseña Jesús: "¿De qué le sirve al hombre ganar el mundo entero si pierde o arruina su vida?" Oremos para que Dios nos conceda la sabiduría de acumular tesoros en el Cielo, donde verdaderamente pertenece nuestro corazón. Amen.
