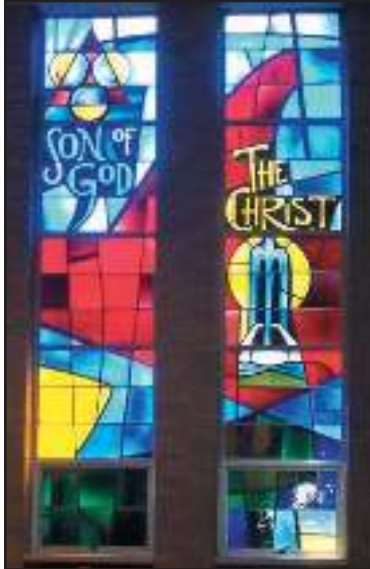

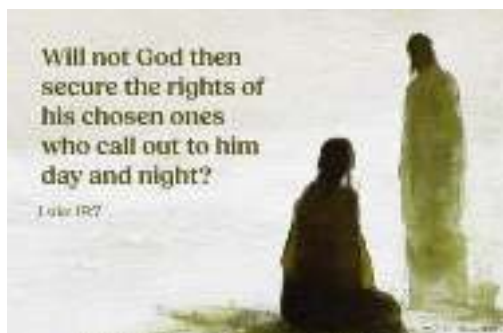

# WORSHIP

## From Your Pastor



Dear brothers and sisters,

We are progressing steadily to conclude this Jubilee Year of Our Lord 2025. Mother Church gives us these Readings that highlight the theme of persistence in prayer and steadfast faith. Each passage offers unique insights into the importance of continuous spiritual dedication.

From Luke's account (Luke 18:1-8) we are presented with the persistent widow. This parable emphasizes persistence in prayer though the story of a widow who repeatedly seeks justice from an unjust judge. Her unwavering determination eventually leads to success illustrating how consistent prayer reflects deep faith. The proverb "The squeaky wheel gets the grease" mirrors this passage's message about persistence.

The Old Testament Reading from Exodus 17:8-13 brings to light, Moses' uplifted hands. This narrative demonstrates the power of sustained spiritual support. As Moses held his hands up, Israel prevailed in battle. When he tired, Aaron and Hur supported his arms, showing how communal support strengthens spiritual persistence. Consider the proverb "Many hands make light work" in relation to this passage. The Responsorial Psalm 121:1-8 offers content on the Lord's constant protection. In this pericope we learn how the Psalm affirms God's unwavering protection and unconditional love and care. The repetitive structure emphasizes the Lord's constant vigilance, reflecting the proverb "The eyes of the Lord are everywhere, keeping watch." The Psalm's message reinforces the certainty of divine protection through all circumstances.

Saint Paul talking to Timothy (2 Timothy 3:14-4:2) could not have put it any better when he suggests being steadfast in scripture. All factors considered, Paul's exhortation to Timothy emphasizes perseverance in faith and teaching. This passage connects to the proverb, "train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it." It underscores the importance of remaining faithful to God's word which is inspired despite the challenges it may lead you to experience.

Clearly these passages collectively illustrate how persistence in faith, fervent prayer, and righteous action leads to spiritual growth and divine response. Empowered by the word of God this Weekend, may we make time for God to apply the content we have heard being proclaimed to us so as to live our faith with sound insights that make us beacons of Christ's light.

# **COMUNIDAD HISPANA**

## **Mensaje Del Pastor, P. John Chrysostom Tibakunirwa**

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, estamos avanzando firmemente hacia la conclusión de este Año Jubilar de Nuestro Señor 2025. La Santa Madre Iglesia nos ofrece estas Lecturas que resaltan el tema de la **perseverancia en la oración y la fe constante**. Cada pasaje nos brinda una perspectiva única sobre la importancia de una dedicación espiritual continua.

En el relato de Lucas (Lucas 18:1-8) se nos presenta la **viuda persistente**. Esta parábola enfatiza la perseverancia en la oración a través de la historia de una viuda que busca repetidamente justicia ante un juez injusto. Su determinación inquebrantable finalmente la lleva al éxito, ilustrando cómo la oración constante refleja una fe profunda. El proverbio "La rueda que más rechina es la que recibe el aceite" refleja el mensaje de este pasaje sobre la persistencia.

La lectura del Antiguo Testamento en Éxodo 17:8-13 pone de relieve **las manos levantadas de Moisés**. Este relato demuestra el poder del apoyo espiritual sostenido. Mientras Moisés mantenía sus manos en alto, Israel prevalecía en la batalla; cuando se cansaba, Aarón y Jur sostenían sus brazos, mostrando cómo el apoyo comunitario fortalece la perseverancia espiritual. Consideremos el proverbio "Muchas manos hacen el trabajo más ligero" en relación con este pasaje. El Salmo Responsorial 121:1-8 nos ofrece contenido sobre la **constante protección del Señor**. En esta perícopa aprendemos cómo el salmo afirma la protección inquebrantable, el amor incondicional y el cuidado de Dios. Su estructura repetitiva enfatiza la vigilancia constante del Señor, reflejando el proverbio: "Los ojos del Señor están en todo lugar, observando." El mensaje del salmo refuerza la certeza de la protección divina en toda circunstancia.

San Pablo, hablando a Timoteo (2 Timoteo 3:14-4:2), lo expresa de manera ejemplar al exhortarlo a ser **firme en la Sagrada Escritura**. Considerando todos los factores, la exhortación de Pablo enfatiza la perseverancia en la fe y en la enseñanza. Este pasaje se conecta con el proverbio: "Instruye al niño en su camino, y aun cuando fuere viejo no se apartará de él." Resalta la importancia de permanecer fiel a la Palabra de Dios, la cual es inspirada, a pesar de las dificultades que pueda traer. Claramente, estos pasajes en conjunto ilustran cómo la **perseverancia en la fe, la oración ferviente y las acciones justas** conducen al crecimiento espiritual y a la respuesta divina. Fortalecidos por la Palabra de Dios este fin de semana, procuremos hacer tiempo para que el Señor aplique en nosotros el mensaje que hemos escuchado proclamado, de modo que vivamos nuestra fe con una comprensión profunda que nos haga **faros de la luz de Cristo**.

Ya comenzamos a **recolectar alimentos para nuestro ministerio de la Cena de Acción de Gracias**. Sus donaciones ayudan a proporcionar cenas de Acción de Gracias para nuestros feligreses y también para muchas familias dentro de nuestro código postal que enfrentan dificultades económicas. Este año estamos haciendo una solicitud "combinada": de **artículos de comida** y también de **donaciones monetarias** para la compra de tarjetas de regalo que permitirán a las familias comprar su pavo, ya que los costos de los alimentos continúan siendo muy altos. Las donaciones de comida pueden dejarse en la **sacristía, junto a las puertas de salida**.

**Artículos necesarios: relleno (stuffing), salsa de arándano (cranberry sauce), papas en caja, vegetales enlatados, salsa de pavo (gravy), macarrones con queso en caja, mezcla para brownies y galletas en caja.**

**Nota:** Las donaciones monetarias pueden ser en efectivo o cheques a nombre de **Holy Name**.
