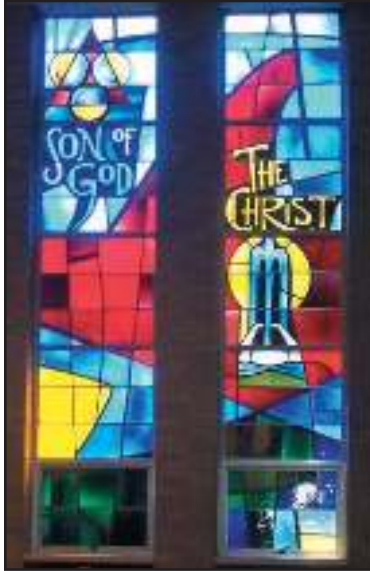

WORSHIP

From Your Pastor



Historically the Lateran Basilica officially known as the Archbasilica of Saint John Lateran, holds a prominent place in our Catholic Church. It is the oldest and ranks first among four Major Basilicas in Rome, serving as the Ecclesiastical seat of the Pope. The basilica's Dedication took place on November 9, 324 AD, during the reign of Emperor Constantine, who was the first Roman Emperor to convert to Catholicity. This event marked a significant shift in the religious landscape of the Roman Empire.

The original structure was built on the site of an ancient Roman palace, which was given to Constantine by the Lateran Family. Its Dedication symbolized the acceptance of Catholicity within the Roman state and the beginning of a New Era where the Catholic Church would flourish openly. The Basilica has undergone several renovations and reconstructions over the Centuries, reflecting the various Architectural styles, from early Christian Baroque. As we meditate on this historical event let us consider the following maxims:

A foundation built on faith endures through time.

The past is a prologue to our present beliefs.

In the heart of Tradition, we find the roots of our Catholic faith.

These maxims encourage us to appreciate the significance of the Lateran Basilica not only as a Historical monument but also as a living testament to the enduring nature of the Catholic Faith and the development of the Catholic Church.

In considering the significance of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, it is essential to explore key biblical texts that enrich our understanding of this momentous event. The passage from Luke 2:13-22, Ezekiel 47:1-2.8-9.12 and Psalm 46:2-6.8-9 provide profound insights into the themes of dedication, Divine presence and the sanctity of Worship.

In Luke 2:13-22, we witness the angels proclaiming Jesus' Birth, emphasizing the Glory of God and the peace He brings. This passage invites to contemplate on the purpose of the Basilica as a site of Divine Encounter, serving as a reminder of the Incarnation's significance in our faith community.

Ezekiel 47:1-2.8.9.12 presents a vision of life-giving water flowing from the Temple, symbolizing the transformative power of God's Presence. This imagery parallels the Basilica's role as a source of spiritual nourishment, highlighting the importance of worship as a conduit for Divine grace.

Psalm 46:2-6.8.9 further reinforces this theme, declaring that God is our refuge and strength, a present help in trouble. The Basilica stands a testament to this truth, inviting us believers to seek solace and strength within its walls.

as we reflect on these readings this weekend, let us remember the maxim: "A house of prayer is a house of peace." The dedication of the Lateran Basilica embodies this truth, serving as a sacred Space where heaven meets Earth, and where we the faith gather to encounter the Divine.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Pastor, P. John Chrysostom Tibakunirwa

Históricamente, la Basílica de Letrán, oficialmente conocida como la Archibasílica de San Juan de Letrán, ocupa un lugar destacado en nuestra Iglesia Católica. Es la más antigua y ocupa el primer lugar entre las cuatro Basílicas Mayores de Roma, sirviendo como la sede eclesial del Papa. La dedicación de la basílica tuvo lugar el 9 de noviembre del año 324 d.C., durante el reinado del emperador Constantino, quien fue el primer emperador romano en convertirse al catolicismo. Este acontecimiento marcó un cambio significativo en el panorama religioso del Imperio Romano.

La estructura original fue construida en el sitio de un antiguo palacio romano, que fue entregado a Constantino por la familia Laterani. Su dedicación simbolizó la aceptación del catolicismo dentro del estado romano y el comienzo de una nueva era en la que la Iglesia Católica florecería abiertamente. La basílica ha pasado por varias renovaciones y reconstrucciones a lo largo de los siglos, reflejando diversos estilos arquitectónicos, desde el cristiano primitivo hasta el barroco. Al meditar sobre este acontecimiento histórico, consideremos las siguientes máximas: Una fundación edificada sobre la fe perdura a través del tiempo. El pasado es prólogo de nuestras creencias presentes. En el corazón de la Tradición encontramos las raíces de nuestra fe católica. Estas máximas nos animan a apreciar la importancia de la Basílica de Letrán, no solo como un monumento histórico, sino también como un testimonio vivo de la naturaleza perdurable de la fe católica y del desarrollo de la Iglesia Católica. Al considerar la importancia de la dedicación de la Basílica de Letrán, es esencial explorar los textos bíblicos clave que enriquecen nuestra comprensión de este acontecimiento trascendental. Los pasajes de Lucas 2:13-22, Ezequiel 47:1-2.8-9.12 y el Salmo 46:2-6.8-9 ofrecen profundas reflexiones sobre los temas de la dedicación, la presencia divina y la santidad del culto. En Lucas 2:13-22, presenciamos a los ángeles proclamando el nacimiento de Jesús, enfatizando la gloria de Dios y la paz que Él trae. Este pasaje nos invita a contemplar el propósito de la basílica como lugar de encuentro divino, recordándonos la importancia de la Encarnación en nuestra comunidad de fe. Ezequiel 47:1-2.8.9.12 presenta una visión del agua vivificante que fluye del templo, simbolizando el poder transformador de la presencia de Dios. Esta imagen se asemeja al papel de la basílica como fuente de alimento espiritual, destacando la importancia del culto como canal de la gracia divina. El Salmo 46:2-6.8.9 refuerza aún más este tema, declarando que Dios es nuestro refugio y fortaleza, auxilio siempre presente en la tribulación. La basílica se erige como testimonio de esta verdad, invitando a los creyentes a encontrar consuelo y fortaleza dentro de sus muros. Al reflexionar sobre estas lecturas este fin de semana, recordemos la máxima: *“Una casa de oración es una casa de paz.”* La dedicación de la Basílica de Letrán encarna esta verdad, sirviendo como un espacio sagrado donde el cielo se une con la tierra, y donde nosotros, los fieles, nos reunimos para encontrarnos con lo divino.
