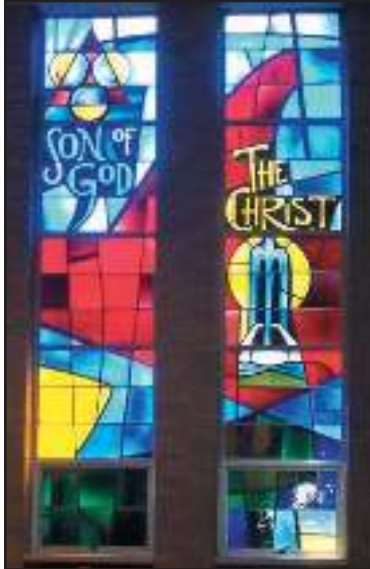

WORSHIP

From Your Pastor



Today's Readings have rich content for us for a lifetime. Luke's passage 21:5-19 talks about signs, perseverance and witness. Luke places Jesus in an eschatological discourse: the destruction of the Temple serves as an occasion to teach about coming tribulation, deception and the need for endurance. What I learn from this is: the signs and persecutions function as tests and as opportunities: believers will face betrayal, imprisonment and hatred, yet will receive a "testimony" through the Spirit that enables bold witness Luke 21:12-15. The promise is not immunity but empowered endurance: perseverance secures salvation for the hearers Luke 21:19. The Rhetorical aim is pastoral: prepare rather than alarm and locate trust in God's sustaining Spirit amid socio-political collapse. Psalm 98:5-9 This Psalm culminates in a vision of the Lord coming to judge the earth with righteousness. The summoned response- sing, shout, and let the sea and fields rejoice - portrays judgement as restoration and public vindication. To this end the Psalm blends eschatological expectation with liturgical praise so to speak divine justice provokes the cosmos rejoicing. for a community facing injustice, Psalm 98 offers confidence that God's intervention will set the World aright, turning judgement into a cause for praise. Prophet Malachi 3:19-20 shares content on the day of the Lord: Punishing and Healing. Malachi contrasts the fate of the wicked and the righteous on the Day of the Lord: those who do evil will be stubble; the righteous will experience healing. The metaphor of stubble and consumption hints at judgement that purifies the covenant community's life. The promise of healing for the faithful points to restorative justice: judgement distinguishes and restores covenantal order.

Saint Paul in 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12 talks substantially on work, disorder and responsibility. As a matter of fact, Paul, rebukes those who refuse to work instructing the community to follow his example of labor and discipline idleness. 2 Thessalonians 3:10" If anyone will not work, let him not eat" This content addresses social disorder threatening communal welfare: Paul grounds ethical exhortations in apostolic example and community survival. discipline is corrective and pragmatic -- so to speak preserving the community's witness and ensuring mutual responsibility. As we delve in these readings let us be reminded, they call us for resilient faith that practices justice and responsibility trusting God's ultimate vindication ad restoration.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Pastor, P. John Chrysostom Tibakunirwa

Las lecturas de hoy tienen un contenido profundo para nosotros, válido para toda la vida. El pasaje de Lucas 21:5-19 habla sobre los signos, la perseverancia y el testimonio. Lucas presenta a Jesús en un discurso escatológico: la destrucción del Templo sirve como ocasión para enseñar sobre la tribulación venidera, el engaño y la necesidad de la perseverancia. Lo que aprendo de esto es que los signos y las persecuciones funcionan como pruebas y como oportunidades: los creyentes enfrentarán traición, prisión y odio, pero recibirán un “testimonio” a través del Espíritu que les permitirá dar un testimonio valiente (Lucas 21:12-15). La promesa no es inmunidad, sino una resistencia fortalecida: la perseverancia asegura la salvación para quienes escuchan (Lucas 21:19). El propósito retórico es pastoral: preparar, más que alarmar, y colocar la confianza en el Espíritu sustentador de Dios en medio del colapso sociopolítico. El Salmo 98:5-9 culmina en una visión del Señor que viene a juzgar la tierra con justicia. La respuesta convocada — cantar, aclamar y dejar que el mar y los campos se regocijen— retrata el juicio como restauración y vindicación pública. Con este fin, el Salmo combina la expectativa escatológica con la alabanza litúrgica, de modo que la justicia divina provoca el regocijo del cosmos. Para una comunidad que enfrenta la injusticia, el Salmo 98 ofrece confianza en que la intervención de Dios pondrá el mundo en orden, convirtiendo el juicio en un motivo de alabanza. El profeta Malaquías 3:19-20 comparte un mensaje sobre el día del Señor: castigo y sanación. Malaquías contrasta el destino de los malvados y los justos en el día del Señor: los que hacen el mal serán como rastrojo; los justos experimentarán sanación. La metáfora del rastrojo y el consumo sugiere un juicio que purifica la vida de la comunidad de la alianza. La promesa de sanación para los fieles apunta a una justicia restauradora: el juicio distingue y restaura el orden de la alianza. San Pablo, en 2 Tesalonicenses 3:7-12, habla de manera sustancial sobre el trabajo, el desorden y la responsabilidad. De hecho, Pablo reprende a quienes se niegan a trabajar, instruyendo a la comunidad a seguir su ejemplo de trabajo y disciplina ante la ociosidad. 2 Tesalonicenses 3:10 dice: “El que no quiera trabajar, que no coma.” Este contenido aborda el desorden social que amenaza el bienestar comunitario: Pablo fundamenta las exhortaciones éticas en el ejemplo apostólico y en la supervivencia de la comunidad. La disciplina es correctiva y pragmática —por así decirlo— preserva el testimonio de la comunidad y garantiza la responsabilidad mutua. Al profundizar en estas lecturas, recordemos que nos llaman a una fe resiliente que practique la justicia y la responsabilidad, confiando en la vindicación y restauración definitiva de Dios.

Ya comenzamos a **recolectar alimentos para nuestro ministerio de la Cena de Acción de Gracias**. Sus donaciones ayudan a proporcionar cenas de Acción de Gracias para nuestros feligreses y también para muchas familias dentro de nuestro código postal que enfrentan dificultades económicas. Este año estamos haciendo una solicitud “combinada”: de **artículos de comida** y también de **donaciones monetarias** para la compra de tarjetas de regalo que permitirán a las familias comprar su pavo, ya que los costos de los alimentos continúan siendo muy altos. Las donaciones de comida pueden dejarse en el cuarto de Albas al lado de la **sacristía, favor de no dejarlas junto a las puertas de salida**.
