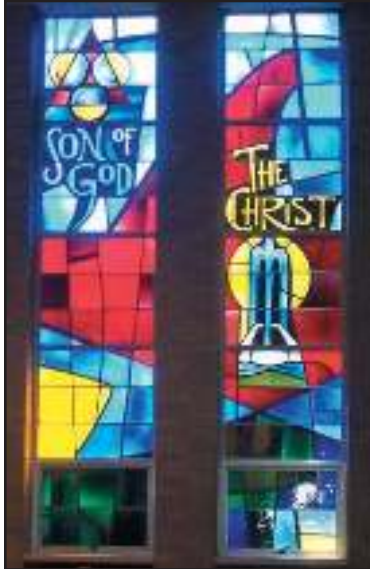

The Law and the Spirit

Dear brothers and sisters, I offer you this reflection that I hope will help you understand and meditate upon this Sunday's readings. These key concepts will make us better able to apply what Jesus says in today's gospel to our everyday lives. In the first reading we learn that God's law is not an optional set up principles that we can choose to take or leave, they are an expression of God's perfect will and are foundational for life itself. To obey God's law is to choose life; to disobey is to choose death. There is no in between option. "No one does he command to act unjustly, to no one does he give license to sin." (Sirach 15: 20). God created us for life and blessedness. "Choose life, then, that you and your descendants may live, by loving the LORD, your God, obeying his voice, and holding fast to him." (Deut. 30: 19b-20a). God's law is not given by an angry God who can't wait to punish us but rather by a loving God who wants to bless us. Our free will, however, demands that we make a choice to love and obey God. That's why we have free will in the first place. Without it, we could not love and without love could not truly live. God's law does not diminish our free will but rather preserves its integrity. Therefore, true freedom means to love and obey God rather than the ability to disobey him. "Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!" (Ps 119: 1). The concept of freedom through obedience isn't very controversial in most matters. If you chose to put delicious Vermont Maple Syrup in your gas tank instead of on your pancakes, would you still expect to have the freedom to drive that car? Of course not! Why then do we get so confused when it comes to freedom and the moral law? Were we designed for good or for evil? If we fill our lives with sinful choices and actions, we self-destruct. If we fill our lives with loving obedience to God, we flourish in freedom. In today's Gospel reading, from the Gospel of Matthew, we hear the next part of Jesus' famous "Sermon on the Mount." Here, Jesus presents himself as a sort of new Moses, a new Law Giver. He comes not to abolish the law but to fulfill it (Mt 5: 17). In fact, Jesus asserts his divine authority even over God's Law as transmitted by Moses. As the fulfillment of the "law and the prophets," Jesus places himself in the position of God, the only one who has the authority to give the law. "You have heard that it was said to your ancestors...but I say to you." (*see today's Gospel*). Yes, by teaching in this way, Jesus is saying that he is equal to God, that he is God, that he is the final authority. This is the reason Jesus was so bitterly hated by his rivals. They simply could not accept who he truly was and so they became his enemies. The same thing happens to us when we disobey God. We are refusing, in some way, to accept who God is. That's why all sin offends God and hurts us. If we want to do God's will in our lives, if we hope to fulfill the law, then we must do so through faith and loving surrender to Jesus. The world we live in pretends to make its own rules and establish its own laws, often times without reference to God's Law or in blatant opposition to it. But, "the rulers of this age are passing away." (*see 1 Cor. 2: 6*). They will not last. However, because God loves his people, he has revealed to us the mysterious wisdom that is in Christ, a wisdom hidden from worldly rulers and from the spiritually immature who falsely believe that freedom means the ability to disobey God. We can call this "the wisdom of the Cross." The Cross of Christ stands as the ultimate witness to God's wisdom. Under the threat of death itself, Jesus did not disobey but "he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." (Phil 2: 8). Because of his sacrifice of loving obedience to the will of the Father, Jesus won freedom from sin and death for us all and gave us eternal life. There can be no greater freedom than freedom in Christ.

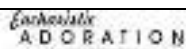

DIOCESE OF SPRINGFIELD 2026 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ends at age fifty-nine (59).

Please note: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Padre Yerick

VI Domingo Tiempo Ordinario

Queridos hermanos, espero que esta reflexión les ayude a comprender y meditar sobre las lecturas de este domingo. Estos conceptos clave nos permitirán aplicar de una manera mejor a nuestra vida diaria lo que Jesús dice en el evangelio. En la primera lectura aprendemos que la ley de Dios no es un conjunto de principios opcionales que podemos tomar o dejar a un lado, sino que son una expresión de la voluntad perfecta de Dios, fundamental para la vida misma. Obedecer la ley de Dios es elegir la vida; desobedecerla es elegir la muerte. No hay una opción intermedia. "A nadie le ha mandado ser impío, y a nadie le ha dado permiso de pecar." (Sir 15:20). Dios nos creó para la vida y la bienaventuranza. "Elige la vida, y vivirás, tú y tus descendientes, con tal que ames al Señor, tu Dios, escuches su voz y le seas fiel." (Dt. 30:19b- 20a). La ley de Dios no es dada por un Dios de ira que espera ansioso para castigarnos, sino por el Dios de amor que quiere bendecirnos. Sin embargo, nuestro libre albedrío nos exige a tomar la decisión de amar y obedecer a Dios. Es precisamente la razón que tenemos el libre albedrío. Sin él, no podríamos amar y sin amor no podríamos vivir de verdad. La ley de Dios no disminuye nuestra libertad, sino que preserva su integridad. Por lo tanto, la verdadera libertad significa amar y obedecer a Dios y no la mera capacidad de desobedecerlo. "Dichosos los que caminan en la voluntad del Señor" (Sal 119: 1). El concepto de libertad a través de la obediencia no es muy controvertido en la mayoría de los asuntos. Si eligieras poner el delicioso jarabe de arce en el tanque de gas y no en los panqueques, ¿crees que todavía tuvieras libertad de conducir ese coche? ¡Claro que no! ¿Por qué será que nos confundimos tanto cuando se trata de la libertad y la ley moral? ¿Fuimos diseñados para el bien o para el mal? Si llenamos nuestras vidas de decisiones y acciones pecaminosas, nos autodestruimos. Si llenamos nuestras vidas de obediencia amorosa a Dios, prosperamos en libertad. Hoy en el Evangelio de San Mateo, escuchamos a Jesús en la siguiente parte del famoso "Sermón del Monte." Aquí, Jesús se presenta como un nuevo Moisés, un nuevo dador de la Ley. Él no viene a abolir la ley, sino a darle plenitud (Mt 5:17). De hecho, Jesús afirma su autoridad divina incluso sobre la Ley de Dios tal como la transmitió Moisés. Siendo él mismo el que da plenitud a la "ley y los profetas," Jesús se coloca en la posición de Dios, el único que tiene la autoridad para dar la ley. "Ustedes han oído que se dijo a sus antepasados... pero yo les digo a ustedes." (ver el Evangelio de hoy). Sí, al enseñar de esta manera, Jesús se iguala a Dios, dice que es Dios, que él es la autoridad final. Por eso sus enemigos odiaban tan amargamente a Jesús. Simplemente no podían aceptar quién era realmente y por eso se convirtieron en sus enemigos. Lo mismo nos pasa cuando desobedecemos a Dios. De alguna manera, nos negamos a aceptar quién es Dios. Por eso todo pecado ofende a Dios y nos hace daño. Si queremos hacer la voluntad de Dios en nuestra vida, si esperamos cumplir la ley, tenemos que hacerlo mediante la fe y una entrega amorosa a Jesús. Vivimos en un mundo que pretende hacer sus propias reglas y establece sus propias leyes, muchas veces sin referencia a la Ley de Dios o en abierta oposición a ella. Pero, "aquellos que dominan al mundo... van a quedar aniquilados." (ver 1 Cor. 2:6). No permanecerán. Sin embargo, porque Dios ama a su pueblo, ha revelado la sabiduría misteriosa que hay en Cristo, una sabiduría oculta a los que dominan al mundo y a los espiritualmente inmaduros que creen falsamente que la libertad significa la capacidad de desobedecer a Dios. Podemos llamarla "la sabiduría de la Cruz." La Cruz de Cristo se erige como el testimonio supremo de la sabiduría de Dios. Bajo la amenaza de la misma muerte, Jesús no desobedeció, sino que "se humilló hasta aceptar por obediencia la muerte y muerte de cruz." (Fil 2:8). Por su sacrificio de obediencia amorosa a la voluntad del Padre, Jesús ganó la libertad del pecado y de la muerte para todos y nos dio la vida eterna. No puede haber mayor libertad que la libertad en Cristo.

DIÓCESIS DE SPRINGFIELD – NORMAS DE CUARESMA 2025

Nota: Aunque los fieles pueden excusarse del ayuno y la abstinencia por una causa justa, existe la obligación de sustituirlos por otra forma de penitencia. Ningún católico debe excusarse ligeramente de estas obligaciones cuaresmales.

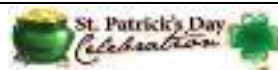
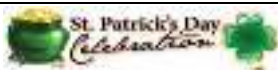
