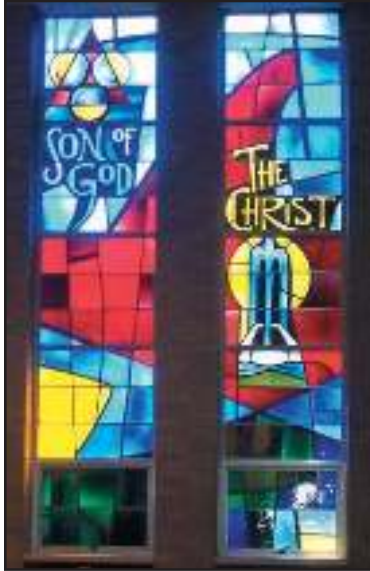

## From Your Parochial Vicar



From Fr. Yerick [First Sunday of Lent]

### **Repent!**

What does it mean to repent? We began the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday when we received blessed ashes upon our heads as a sign of repentance. But what exactly are we supposed to do and experience when we repent? Most of us know about “giving something up” for Lent. We know not to eat meat on Fridays and to observe the days of Fasting. We hear about giving alms and increasing our prayer. But why do any of these things? The heart of Lent is the call of Jesus to “Repent and believe in the Gospel.” (See Mk. 1:15). Other names for repentance include contrition, conversion of heart, and interior penance. If we don’t have these then the other things we do during Lent are empty, fake, and do not benefit us spiritually. Only when we have interior repentance together with the external actions of penance do we begin to live the true meaning of Lent. “Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end of sin, a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward the evil actions we have committed. At the same time it entails the desire and resolution to change one’s life, with hope in God’s mercy and trust in the help of his grace. This conversion of heart is accompanied by a salutary pain and sadness which the Fathers called *animi cruciatus* (affliction of spirit) and *compunctio cordis* (repentance of heart).” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 1431). This interior repentance is what should move us to exterior actions like fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. The exterior actions, in turn, reinforce our conversion of heart, lead us to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and dispose us to a more perfect love of God and our neighbor. So when you feel that interior sadness and distance from God and neighbor, when you get the sense that things could be better between you and God and you want a real change, don’t be afraid. Give thanks to God because he is moving your heart by his grace. He is moving you towards repentance. Repentance does not mean sitting around feeling sorry for our sins and letting our guilt get the best of us. Repentance is our cooperation with God’s grace to take action and actually do something about our sins. Don’t fear repentance; pray for it. It is a gift from God. Repentance is the first step towards healing. Remember that Jesus did not come to condemn you he came to save you. (see John 3:17). Our faith in him leads us to repentance and through repentance God leads us to forgiveness and salvation.

### **DIocese of Springfield 2026 Lenten Regulations**

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one’s needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ends at age fifty-nine (59).

Please note: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.

## COMUNIDAD HISPANA

### **Mensaje Del Padre Yerick 1er Domingo del tiempo de Cuaresma ¡Arrepiéntete!**

¿Qué significa arrepentirse? Comenzamos la temporada de Cuaresma con el Miércoles de Ceniza, cuando recibimos cenizas benditas sobre nuestras cabezas como señal de arrepentimiento. Pero, qué exactamente debemos hacer y experimentar cuando nos arrepentimos? La mayoría de nosotros conocemos la práctica de "renunciar a algo" durante la Cuaresma. Sabemos que no debemos comer carne los viernes y que debemos observar los días de ayuno. Hemos oído que debemos dar limosna y aumentar nuestra oración. Pero, por qué debemos hacer cualquiera estas cosas? El corazón de la Cuaresma es el llamado de Jesús a "Arrepiéntanse y crean en el Evangelio" (ver Mc. 1:15). Otros nombres para el arrepentimiento incluyen contrición, conversión del corazón y penitencia interior. Si no tenemos estos, entonces las otras cosas que hacemos durante la Cuaresma son vacías, falsas y no nos benefician espiritualmente. Solo cuando tenemos arrepentimiento interior junto con las acciones externas de la penitencia comenzamos a vivir el verdadero significado de la Cuaresma. « La penitencia interior es una reorientación radical de toda la vida, un retorno, una conversión a Dios con todo nuestro corazón, una ruptura con el pecado, una aversión del mal, con repugnancia hacia las malas acciones que hemos cometido. Al mismo tiempo, comprende el deseo y la resolución de cambiar de vida con la esperanza de la misericordia divina y la confianza en la ayuda de su gracia. Esta conversión del corazón va acompañada de dolor y tristeza saludables que los Padres llamaron animi cruciatus (aflicción del espíritu), compunctio cordis (arrepentimiento del corazón)» (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, n. 1431). Este arrepentimiento interior es lo que debería impulsarnos a acciones exteriores como el ayuno, la oración y la limosna. Estas acciones exteriores, a su vez, refuerzan nuestra conversión del corazón, nos conducen al Sacramento de la Reconciliación y nos disponen a un amor más perfecto de Dios y del prójimo. Así que cuando sientas esa tristeza interior y distancia de Dios y del prójimo, cuando te dice tu corazón que las cosas podrían estar mejor entre tú y Dios y deseas un cambio real, no tengas miedo. Da gracias a Dios porque está moviendo tu corazón por su gracia. Te está moviendo hacia el arrepentimiento. Arrepentirse no significa quedarse sentado sintiéndose mal por nuestros pecados y dejar que nuestra culpa nos domine. El arrepentimiento es nuestra cooperación con la gracia de Dios para tomar acción y realmente hacer algo con respecto a nuestros pecados. No temas al arrepentimiento; pídelo en oración. Es un regalo de Dios. El arrepentimiento es el primer paso hacia la sanación. Recuerda que Jesús no vino a condenarte, vino a salvarte. (ver Juan 3:17). Nuestra fe en él nos conduce al arrepentimiento y, a través del arrepentimiento, Dios nos lleva al perdón y a la salvación.

Estas virtudes son alabadas con otros nombres en muchos pasajes de la Escritura.” (CIC 1805)

### DIÓCESIS DE SPRINGFIELD – NORMAS DE CUARESMA 2025

3. La obligación de abstenerse de carne comienza a los catorce (14) años y no cesa.
4. La obligación de ayunar comienza a los dieciocho (18) años y termina a los cincuenta y nueve (59) años.

**Nota:** Aunque los fieles pueden excusarse del ayuno y la abstinencia por una causa justa, existe la obligación de sustituirlos por otra forma de penitencia. Ningún católico debe excusarse ligeramente de estas obligaciones cuaresmales.
