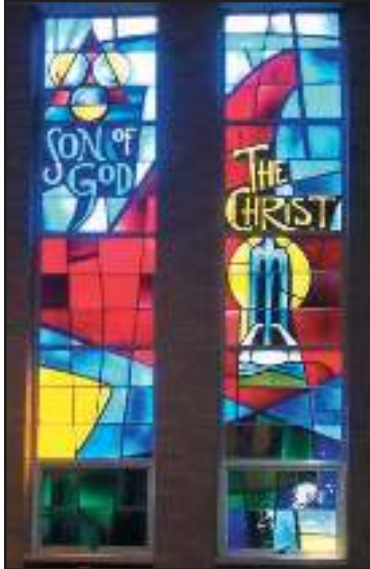

WORSHIP

From Your Pastor



The context and setting We hear from John's Gospel 4:5-42 this Weekend by Jacob's well in Sychar, Samaria presents Jesus tired from travel, sits at the well while His disciples buy food. A Samaritan woman comes to draw water. This scene crosses cultural boundaries: Jews and Samaritans usually avoided close contact, and men did not typically speak publicly with an unrelated woman. Jesus asks the woman for water, surprising her because Jews normally did not ask Samaritans for help. He offers her "living water", promising satisfaction beyond ordinary well water. The conversation moves from everyday needs (physical thirst) to spiritual truth (true worship and the Messiah). The woman recognizes Jesus as the Prophet and then as the Messiah; she tells others in town. Many Samaritans come to hear Jesus and believe, and many declare faith because of the woman's testimony and Jesus's words. Jesus initiates the encounter with a direct, need -based request that opens deeper dialogue. The dialogue shows progressive revelation; the woman understands more as the conversation continues from water- Prophet-Messiah. The use of everyday imagery (a well water, drawing) grounds deep theological claims in ordinary life. The townspeople's response highlights that personal testimony combined with Jesus's teaching can lead to community belief. Think about barriers you see between people (groups who don't talk or share). Jesus' example shows it's important to listen, show respect, and share good news across those barriers. Living water reminds us that some needs (acceptance, purpose) aren't fully met by things like Phones, sports or friends alone; As Christians we believe Jesus offers us deeper lasting fulfillment.

DIOCESE OF SPRINGFIELD 2026 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ends at age fifty-nine (59).

Please note: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

There will be a **MANDATORY WORKSHOP** on Saturday, March 21, 2026 at the Social Center starting at 10:00a.m. for All Confirmation teens, preteens, and teens....**OLDER** student(s) making their first Reconciliation and First Communion. This is required to complete your older child’s formation towards their Sacrament(s).

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Mensaje Del Padre John Chrisostom Tibakunirwa

El contexto y el escenario: Este fin de semana escuchamos del Evangelio de Juan 4, 5-42. Junto al pozo de Jacob, en Sicar de Samaría, se nos presenta a Jesús cansado del viaje, sentado junto al pozo mientras sus discípulos van a comprar comida. Una mujer samaritana llega a sacar agua. Esta escena rompe barreras culturales: los judíos y los samaritanos normalmente evitaban el contacto cercano, y los hombres no solían hablar en público con una mujer que no fuera de su familia. Jesús le pide agua a la mujer, sorprendiéndola, porque los judíos normalmente no pedían ayuda a los samaritanos. Él le ofrece «agua viva», prometiendo una satisfacción que va más allá del agua común del pozo. La conversación pasa de las necesidades cotidianas (la sed física) a la verdad espiritual (la verdadera adoración y el Mesías). La mujer reconoce a Jesús primero como profeta y luego como el Mesías; ella va y se lo cuenta a los del pueblo. Muchos samaritanos vienen a escuchar a Jesús y creen; y muchos profesan su fe tanto por el testimonio de la mujer como por las palabras de Jesús. Jesús inicia el encuentro con una petición directa basada en una necesidad, lo que abre un diálogo más profundo. El diálogo muestra una revelación progresiva: la mujer comprende cada vez más a medida que avanza la conversación, pasando del agua, a profeta, a Mesías. El uso de imágenes cotidianas (el pozo, el agua, el acto de sacar agua) fundamenta profundas afirmaciones teológicas en la vida ordinaria. La respuesta del pueblo destaca que el testimonio personal, combinado con la enseñanza de Jesús, puede llevar a la fe comunitaria. Pensemos en las barreras que vemos entre las personas (grupos que no hablan ni comparten entre sí). El ejemplo de Jesús nos muestra que es importante escuchar, mostrar respeto y compartir la Buena Nueva a través de esas barreras. El agua viva nos recuerda que algunas necesidades (como la aceptación y el propósito) no se satisfacen plenamente solo con cosas como los teléfonos, los deportes o los amigos. Como cristianos, creemos que Jesús nos ofrece una plenitud más profunda y duradera.

Nota: Aunque los fieles pueden excusarse del ayuno y la abstinencia por una causa justa, existe la obligación de sustituirlos por otra forma de penitencia. Ningún católico debe excusarse ligeramente de estas obligaciones cuaresmales.

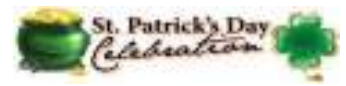
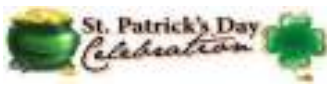

(Wis. 8:7) These virtues are praised under other names in many passages of Scripture."
